From the Pastor's Study

Greetings,

I have been listening to the sound of laughing children all morning. On this third day of Vacation Bible School, there are close to one hundred children throughout our facilities. They are singing, laughing, playing, and learning. They are hearing about God's love. They are learning stories from the Bible. They are learning that God is always with them. Today's key saying is – "God keeps all his promises – Fear Not." That is good to remember at any age.

It is hard to know exactly what impact something like Vacation Bible School has. We are planting actually remember? What lessons will they assimilate? It is hard to say.

But we already see evidences that our efforts make a difference. The attendance has been strong through the entire week, an indication the children are enjoying the experience. One mother told me that she had brought more friends each day because her children's friends heard what fun it was. We are having increased sign-ups for other summer activities because of the good experience with Vacation Bible School. The children are praising God with their voices in the opening and closing worship times. One child told her mother, "I wish we could do Vacation Bible School every day of the year."

The children are especially attentive during story time. The story "rotation" is not a boring time. On Monday they climbed over a mountain (of couch cushions) to experience the burning bush.

behind the curtain in the story room), he asked the children what they wanted. They replied, "Let my people go." When Pharaoh refused, they helped him experience the plagues. For hail they threw wadded up pieces of white paper. For the plague of boils, they stuck round red stickers on Pharaoh while he slept. It was an especially memorable retelling of the story of the plagues.

We do not know the impact of every seed we plant. But we do trust that God will help make them grow. There is plenty of evidence this is happening. One of our Central children was "coaching" another child (who does not often attend church) on how to pray. He said, "Just say 'Dear God', then tell him some things you are thankful for, like 'for my family and this world you made', and when you are finished say, 'Amen'." When our children start helping other children know about Jesus, we know the seeds are taking root.

A great host of volunteers have been working behind the scenes. It has been a lot of work. But it has been worth it. One young girl asked one of our leaders, "Do you know why I come to Vacation Bible School every day?" The leader replied, "No." The child replied, "Because I believe in God." The scriptures remind us that our labors, in the Lord, are not in vain.
